The National Animal Control Association offers the NACA 100, which is a certification course for animal control officers. The course is designed to provide training specifically for individuals involved in the field of animal control. The course is presented in two, one-week sessions. The Level I and II sessions must be successfully completed to receive National Certification.

The National Animal Control Association hereby declares that discrimination on the grounds of race, creed, color, national origin, political or religious affiliations, sex, sexual orientation, age, marital status, family relationship and disability is prohibited by or within the association.

The following guidelines describe our scholarship eligibility requirements:

Qualifications

- 1) You must be currently employed or interested in obtaining employment in the Animal Control field.
- 2) You must provide an explanation as to why you need financial assistance.
- 3) You must be a current NACA member or will obtain a NACA individual membership upon submission of your application.

Disqualifications

- 1) Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- 2) If a scholarship is awarded and then not utilized, except under emergency circumstances, then the applicant will forfeit any future opportunity to apply for a NACA scholarship.
- 3) If the application is postmarked less than 45 days prior to the date of the class that is being requested.
