The National Animal Care & Control Association is committed to setting the standard of professionalism in animal welfare and public safety through training, networking, and advocacy.


Vision


Priority: Increase Access to Training

2022, NACA was able to reduce barriers and improve access to training for hundreds of officers through free or scholarship funded training programs. In addition, NACA focused on ensuring its members had access to resources, equipment, and the tools necessary to safely and effectively perform their roles.

Performance Metrics

In 2022, NACA saw the continued success of our online National Animal Control Officer certification program, both levels I and II. We also saw high demand for other innovative learning modules we offered outside of those curriculums. Despite much of the world returning to in-person learning, online offerings meet the needs of today's ACOs, which is why in 2023, we plan to grow our online learning syllabus even further.




