# Disaster Preparedness Emergency Kit Checklist

Basic pet first aid kit (Gloves, Cotton swabs & and balls, pet-safe antiseptic lotion, powder, or spray, gauze, scissors, tape, wet or grooming wipes)
Towel
Extra food and water
Pet medications
Food and water bowls/buckets
Leash, halters, harnesses, walking equipment
Vaccination records
Bedding and/or towels
Sanitation and cleaning supplies (paper towels, pet friendly cleaner, wipes, poop bags, trash bag, litter box, scoop, etc.)
Transport carriers, crates, cages, or trailer options
Photos of you and your pet together





### Pro Tip 1:

Make sure your animals are trained and comfortable with the crates and loaded into a trailer to avoid delays or unnecessary stress during times of disaster

## Pro Tip 2:

Add alternative contacts whenever possible to ensure your pets have the best chance at reunification if separated

### Pro Tip 3:

Photos that have owners with the pets in them may help reunification efforts

#### Pro Tip 4:

Research identification methods for all your pets – bird bands, horse mane tags, and microchips for pets like reptiles and rabbits. **Pro Tip 5:** 

Regularly check your NACA GO NOW Emergency kit to keep food fresh, medications updated and consider the seasons – blankets in the winter and spray bottles in the summer may come in handy!
